



Parent Sign-In

Please be aware that when you come into the school for any reason it is important to sign in at the office before entering the school. If you are volunteering, you will sign in and grab a volunteer badge before proceeding to your volunteer location. At morning drop off and after school pick up, parents are asked to remain outside the school. There are supervisors available in the mornings to help guide children to their classes, and the teachers will bring younger students to meet their parents just outside the front doors at the end of the day.

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Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) Parking

On the south end of the SAINT-ANDRÉ school site along the bus lane, the Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) staff have reserved parking. The only exception is for our families who require a Handicap parking stall of which there are two. The Town of Beaumont Bylaw Enforcement will be monitoring the area and I have been told they will be ticketing parents who park in this area. I want to thank our parents for respecting our FCSS neighbors by NOT parking or dropping off their students in the FCSS staff parking area.

On another traffic note, parents are asked not to use the bus lane or staff parking lot to drop off or pick up their child.

School Wide Rules

We are asking parents to review the following school wide rules with their children:

- Use inside voice indoors
- During class time, turn off your voice in hallways
- Care for your school environment.
- Be polite and use your manners.

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Emergency Preparedness – STAR



The following is to assist our parents in understanding how they can assist during an emergency.

Emergency Priorities:

During an emergency, STAR Catholic's first priority is the safety of our students and staff, together with communications with our parents and the safe re-unification of students and parents. In the event of emergency, STAR Catholic will inform our parents as quickly as possible where the **Re-Unification Staging Area is located and how quickly they can safely reunite with their children**.

What can parents do?

Parents need to refrain from going to the school during a school emergency, as arrival at the school may impede the access and efforts of emergency responders or expose themselves and their children to danger. *Parents should proceed to the Re-Unification Staging Area as instructed.*

In the event of gas leaks, do not try to contact your child via cell phone as the use of electronic devices may cause an ignition of the gases and is dangerous in such events.

The following Emergency Protocols have been developed to keep our staff and students safe:

Hold & Secure:	 School is locked to keep the threat out.
Lockdown:	 School and rooms are locked to isolate the threat or incident.
Gas Leak:	 Staff and students will either hold a shelter-in-place or evacuate depending on the specifics of the gas leak. Electronics can pose a danger during a gas leak and are not to be used.
Fire Evacuations:	 Staff and students will be evacuated in the event of fire.
Severe Weather:	 This usually means high winds, tornadoes, ice storms or blizzards. Students and staff will remain at the school in these events, as the school is the safest place.

We can all be CHAMPIONS for **Mental Health!**

Great idea! But how does a busy family find time to be a CHAMPION?

- It is the simple things we can do in our everyday lives that will make a difference for people living with a mental illness or a mental health concern.
- It is the simple things that can help end the stigma around mental illness.

Stigma is the product of myth & misunderstanding. It causes people to fear and reject those who live with mental illness.

Language Matters

Think about the language we use; is it positive or negative towards mental health? As a family, practice positive ways to talk about mental health: use respectful language

Try:

- Person with bipolar disorder Instead of: Person with schizophrenia She's bipolar Schizophrenic People with mental illness The mentally ill Died by suicide Committed Suicide
 - avoid labels such as: X
 - Challenged
 - Crazy X
 - Demented
 - Lunatic
 - Schizo
- Sufferer Wacko Normal/Not normal

Empathy Matters

Empathy: the ability to understand and share the feelings of another.

Mental health problems can cause a big change in the way a person thinks, their emotions, the way they act, and their ability to work and carry on with their usual relationships.

- see the person, not the condition
- understand that mental illness can happen to anyone
- view mental illness and physical illness in the same way
- listen, without judging or blaming learn about resources and supports available and help them get "connected"

Knowledge Matters

challenge the myths around mental illness Here are 10 common myths from cmha.ca Mental illnesses aren't real illnesses. Mental illnesses will never affect me. Mental illness is an excuse for poor behaviour. Bad parenting causes mental illnesses. People with mental illnesses are violent & dangerous. People don't recover from mental illnesses. People who experience mental illnesses are weak & can't handle stress. People who experience mental illnesses can't work. Kids can't have a mental illness like depression.

Everyone gets depressed as they grow older. It's just part of the aging process.
